




- Metadiscourses discourse about discourse

Merely a correlation?



Now you can say things about language that it's less PC to say about the people- the people are "erased"!

Perceptual dialectology

- What do people believe about language varieties?
 - Which ones and where?
 - What they "mean" (indexically)
- These beliefs often stand in for beliefs about people





Figure 16. A hypothetical (partial) US regard network (or "attitudinal cognitorium," see Figure 12) for a southern identity



Michigan-Alabama language war


What do Southerners think of themselves?


Are Michiganders' and Alabamans' beliefs symmetrical?

Why South Carolina?

- Alabamans thought it was more 'correct' than them yet equally 'pleasant'
- Low number of Alabama respondents, and those old maps have kept being used to represent the South

South Carolinians






- Preston's (1998) Michiganders showed wider range of scores
- Northwest, Colorado, North Midlands shared highs
- New Jersey and AL/MS/LA shared lows
- Different treatment of Upper Great Lakes, North Midlands




"he runs good"?

Washington is only "correct" because other places aren't.









Linguistically secure SC'ians


- More secure about America's language in general (6.82 vs. 5.92)
- MN/WI/IA/MI = the anti-SC?






Linguistically secure South Carolinians

Rated South Carolina high (8-10)






- Preston's Michigan similar to insecure South Carolinians
